You could always turn it into a book and draw some illustrations!

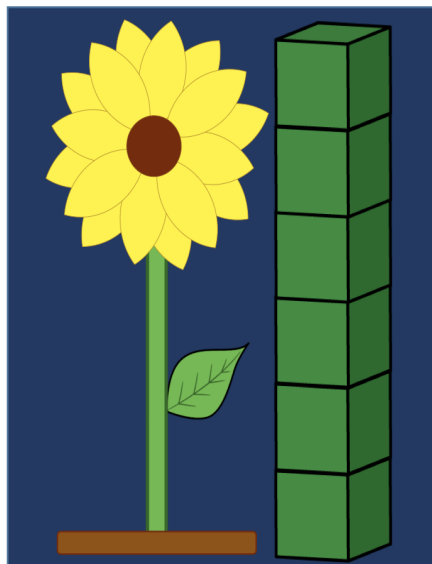
For example:

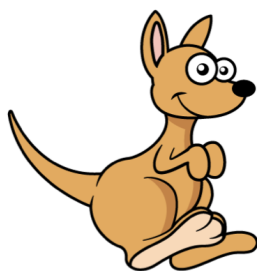
